## From the CEO

I've always appreciated new beginnings, especially this one. I stepped into the role of Tides Canada CEO in March this year with a huge amount of excitement. Before I joined, I knew that Tides Canada had a great reputation in the sector as a bridge builder, philanthropic advisor, and for providing essential supports for community initiatives across the country. But what I hadn't realized was just how much impact this organization is achieving – humbly, effectively, and with such courage.

My entire career has been in the not-for-profit sector in the pursuit of gender equality, promoting sustainable economic development, advancing rights, and protecting the planet. and community leaders, including their revitalization of culture and language. In the Pacific, we help ensure the implementation of the critical Great Bear Rainforest agreements is adhered to while enhancing Indigenous-led stewardship of this global treasure.

In Manitoba, we are forging a unique partnership of funders with First Nations and community members who lead local solutions for food sovereignty and healthy communities. We continue to expand these efforts by partnering with Indigenous leaders and organizations that are best suited to drive these land and community-based solutions across Canada.

Because of all we do across the charitable sector, and locally in hundreds of communities across Canada, it has, admittedly, been a

challenge to describe succinctly just what Tides Canada is all about. Therefore, in the coming months, we're working on a branding project to better explain our unique offering and role in the country. Just because we work on complex solutions doesn't mean it has to be so complicated to explain.

We are also seeking more ways to amplify community-led solutions for the environment, social equity, and decent work. One such way is through our newly launched ImpactDAF, Canada's first customizable donor advised fund to be 100% invested for impact. The ImpactDAF combines impact investing and charitable giving together to maximize philanthropy for social and environmental good.

The world around us is only getting more politically, economically, and climatically volatile, so focusing on bottom-up solutions with communities in front is key to our collective resilience.

In the coming months, I look forward to connecting with you and the other philanthropic and community leaders that are part of the Tides Canada ecosystem. I couldn't be more energized to be part of this organization going forward as we leverage our collective power to make more real change happen.

# Northern spirit of innovation is alive in EntrepreNorth's first cohort

*Empower. Connect. Accelerate. Fresh, bold ideas from nine Northern entrepreneurs level up with EntrepreNorth.*

Handcrafted soaps made with bowhead whale oil, earrings adorned with dentalium shells and moosehide, and sage "smokeless smudge" spray inspired by traditional Dene medicine – these are just some of the products created by the nine Northerners that made up EntrepreNorth's first ever cohort of entrepreneurs.

The first cohort to take on EntrepreNorth's six month training program had the opportunity to travel across the North, connect with like-minded entrepreneurs, celebrate Northern and Indigenous culture, and network with funders/investors and the broader business community. The program's unique combination of cohort

based learning, distant applied work sprints, tailored business mentorship, and life coaching helps entrepreneurs develop business leadership skills, and become investment and market ready.

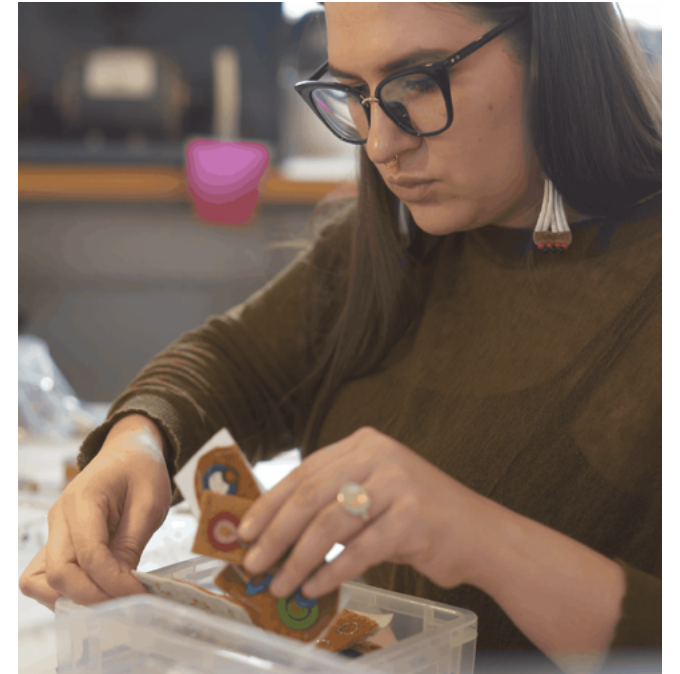
The fresh, bold, inspiring ideas coming out of these Northern entrepreneurs didn't surprise us. Over the past decade, our work with community partners across Canada's North has taught us that Northerners are full of great ideas like these – that push the envelope, address unique challenges, and drive social change. Often living in remote communities dotted across a vast landscape, Northerners face high living costs and the devastating long-lasting effects of climate change, resource development, and colonization. It's no wonder that their innovation spirit is palpable.

But starting your own business is tough, even without the added pressures of uniquely Northern challenges. EntrepreNorth, a project of Tides Canada's shared platform, was developed to address these challenges and to empower Northern Indigenous entrepreneurs to build sustainable businesses and livelihoods.

EntrepreNorth's vision of Indigenous and community-based businesses strengthening self-determined ways of life is at the core of what we are trying to do here at Tides Canada. We believe that those embedded in the community and closest to its complex problems are in a unique position to address shared challenges. Solutions born at the community level are the best catalysts of prosperity, the strongest drivers of social change, and the most likely to go the distance.

The nine entrepreneurs that took part in EntrepreNorth's first cohort are case in point.

# Digital Justice Lab builds a more equitable future



Digital Justice Lab Director, Nasma Ahmed

*During a time when technology is so ubiquitous in our lives, Digital Justice Lab brings technology back to the people by imagining alternative digital futures that are rooted in equity and justice.*

Digital Justice Lab is a Toronto-based shared platform project at Tides Canada. Led by Project Director Nasma Ahmed, Digital Justice Lab strives to create alternative digital futures that are rooted in equity and bring technology back to the people. The Lab holds events and training, engages in policy and legal intervention around digital issues, and partners with organizations on projects centred around digital topics and issues. The team is also set to begin an 11-month project with Trinity Square Video called Virtual Grounds, which will explore feminist perspectives on digital sustainability and survival.

By engaging with diverse communities and collaborating with stakeholders including technologists, policymakers, and community activists, the project helps to shape a better understanding of technology and its impact on communities across the country, supporting them in making informed decisions around digital issues.

### What inspired Digital Justice Lab? How did it begin?

*I was doing a lot of consulting work with non-profits in Canada and the US, and I noticed that, in the Canadian landscape, there weren’t a lot of organizations focusing on technology, and specifically how it relates to racial justice, equity, and power. These issues were part of a lot of the conversations I was having with prior clients. And so, in consultation with a bunch*



of people, we decided to experiment and see what it means to have these conversations—these really uncomfortable conversations—in a bigger way. And that’s how Digital Justice Lab started.

**Why do you think it is important to build a more just and equitable future in the digital space?**

No matter where we live or what we do, digital technologies are ingrained in almost every part of our work. I really do believe that communication is a human right, so it’s crucial to think through questions around how to ensure people have equal access to technology, have connected opportunities, and feel a sense of ownership – collective ownership. Right now, we talk about the digital divide and the lack of digital literacy. As technology is immersed in our daily lives there is a lot to be lost, but there is also a lot to be gained through that.

Digital Justice Lab looks at how to minimize the loss and maximize gain. We’re trying to figure out more effective ways to approach technology in a way that it’s not something that happens to you, but something that can be collaborative and beneficial. We also want people to have a critical understanding of where their data is going and who has access to what. It is so important to ground this topic in equity. We do

this by being specific about who we partner with and who we get money from. Most of our partners are equity seeking groups or those that help advance this work. Our pedagogy and facilitation approaches are also grounded in anti-oppression and anti-racism. Technology’s presence is only expanding, so ensuring that justice and equity are a part of the equation allows us to imagine participatory solutions where consumers can take more of a lead.

**Why did you join Tides Canada’s Shared Platform?**

We decided to join the shared platform because it holds space for us to experiment, which we really appreciate. I think it’s harder to take it slow and purposeful when you’re running an entire non-profit and there’s a lot more work to do. Being on a shared platform prevents us from scaling too fast and allows us to take it a bit easier by reducing some of the risk of failure. We weren’t sure if we were even interested in a non-profit model to begin. Joining Tides Canada allows us to see what’s possible.

**What are the main benefits of this model?**

The first benefit is the resources and support that are available. The second benefit is the collective approach that’s taken to administrative work and resources because you have an entire admin team to support you. Third, I would say that when you’re in the place of experimentation, the shared platform model allows you to incubate in a really good way.

**How might the digital landscape in Canada changing over the next few years?**

There’s increasing public awareness around the issue of privacy, security, and surveillance, and the role big tech companies play in our lives. Over the next few years, if done well, there is a lot of opportunity for us to build stronger

protection mechanisms and better policies that are grounded in what people value. Public awareness has improved over the years, and I believe that the landscape can shift, and I think Canada can be a leader in this space. It really does depend on who takes leadership, but I do think Canada has an opportunity to do so, especially internationally.

**What advice would you give to other people who are thinking of starting a community-led project?**

Go for it! If you feel like you have the supports in place, and if you can, just go for it. It’s really difficult, especially if your focus is quite massive, but the more projects we have, the better. We’re seeing the importance of collaboratives, community-led, and community-based organizations and projects. Always go for it. But I would also say to always question your intent and why you’re doing it. Always map out the “why.”

# A donor makes a remarkable gift



Toni Frisby in Prague.

*Toni Frisby passed away in 2017, age 60, leaving a generous – and surprise – gift to Tides Canada in her estate. We talk to some of the people closest to her to learn more about the remarkable woman she was, and what might have inspired her generosity.*

By all accounts, Toni Frisby was one of a kind.

“You could just feel the positive energy radiating out of her,” says Wendy Frisby, Toni’s sister-in-law (married to Toni’s brother Mike) and her close friend of nearly five decades. “She always had a laugh and warm hug for people.”

“For me, Toni’s best trait was her sense of humour,” says Jane Thomson, Toni’s best friend since grade 5. “She could always find something

to laugh about, and she’d laugh at herself often. She had this giant laugh. I miss that!”

Born in Edmonton in 1956, Toni Frisby grew up spending summers with her parents and brother Mike on Vancouver Island, the two siblings often “running the beaches of Cowichan” as kids. As a young teen, Jane says, Toni was already demonstrating an independent streak and a love of nature. After high school, she signed up for two tree planting seasons. “You have to understand that planting trees in Northern Alberta is hard work,” Mike laughs. “You need some real love for things green to do that!”

Soon Toni was kicking off a life-long interest in travel, starting with a solo-backpacking trek across Australia and New Zealand (followed later by kayaking trips in Patagonia and Haida Gwaii, and hiking on Baffin Island). She got a





geography degree at the University of Victoria, and then a Master's in Environmental Studies with a focus on water management at the University of Waterloo.



Her career began in the 1980s working at an outdoor education centre in Ontario, where she taught thousands of urban children about ecological sustainability and wilderness survival. She then worked in Sault Ste. Marie for the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources, translating science and policy into education programs for frontline staff. "She had a very strong environmental ethic, she was very warm and committed, and everyone just loved Toni," says Bev Robson, Toni's supervisor at the Ministry, who later became one of Toni's close, lifelong friends.

By the mid-1990s, a job offer brought Toni to North Vancouver. By then, Wendy and Mike, and Jane, had all settled there too – and living close to them was a huge part of the appeal.

It was in North Van that Toni made some of her life's greatest contributions – in her career and as a human being. She founded a running group, the North Shore Lemmings, and for 20 years led the group in twice-weekly runs. Whenever someone was new, Toni would run or walk with them, making sure they felt included.

Her personal relationships were everything. There were large "Frisby Family Dinners" where Toni was integral. There was her unparalleled dedication to her niece and nephew, Kelly and Ben (Wendy and Mike's children), and to Jane's children, Andrew and Maddie, too. Toni was the type of person who always had your back. "It was a given," says Mike, "If you needed someone, she was the first person you called. Toni would be there."

In B.C., Toni made an indelible contribution towards environmental protection. After stints as an environmental manager for the Vancouver Airport and Terasen Gas, she joined Western Canada Marine Response, an organization contracted by the BC government to handle oil spill responses in coastal and navigable inland waters. She later founded her own consulting business doing similar work.

It was tough, bringing diverse groups together to develop and execute a response plan, particularly under the massive scrutiny and time pressures that accompany most marine spills. But by all accounts, Toni was an extraordinary leader and facilitator; in several high profile cases (for example, the MV Marthassa bunker oil spill in 2015), she and her team were lauded for their quick and highly effective work in limiting damage. In one of her final career highlights, she drafted a strategic plan to guide the province's marine spill first responders in the future, something she was very proud of.

When cancer struck, as it sadly did (and much too soon), Toni faced it head on, with Jane, Wendy, and Mike as her caregivers. After she passed away, hundreds of people came to her celebration of life, dressed in colourful clothing to honour her personality. Many guests – including some of those closest to her – were surprised to learn about Toni's legacy of environmental contributions. Toni, it seems, despite her vibrant personality, was quite modest about her achievements.

That wasn't Toni's only surprise. In her will, she left large unrestricted donations to three charities, including Tides Canada. It was an extraordinary legacy gift – and one that came as a surprise for both Tides Canada and the people closest to her. Toni had never mentioned the organization to Mike, Wendy, or Jane before.

"But as we learned more, we were smiling, going 'Oh yeah, this is why she chose them,'" says Wendy. "The way Tides Canada works matches her so well. Toni was a connector and a collaborator, she was community-oriented, and she saw the value in bringing even opposing stakeholders together."

"As soon as I learned more about Tides Canada, I said, 'This is perfect for Toni. It's such a fit,'" says Jane. "She would have done her research, she probably knew [all about the organization]. There was a lot of trust there."

"She always worked hard to have an understanding of all sides of an issue and bring together different people. Her approach was always, 'let's find a solution that makes it better for everyone.' That's something I really admired about her," says Mike.

And so do we.

# People, place, prosperity: Strategic investment in the Great Bear Rainforest

*It has been 10 years since First Nations, environmental groups, governments, logging companies, and local communities set aside their differences and created the Great Bear Rainforest Agreements. To celebrate this milestone, we are taking a look back at the resulting impact, and how the lessons learned have guided our work across the rest of Canada.*

The Great Bear Rainforest is a 6.4 million hectare coastal temperate rainforest on British Columbia's north and central coast — equivalent in size to Ireland. It is the unceded traditional territory of 26 First Nations and contains some of the oldest and largest trees on earth, as well as a rich biodiversity of plants and animals.

It has been 10 years since First Nations, environmental groups, governments, logging companies, and local communities set aside their differences and worked together on one of the most significant conservation agreements ever negotiated—protecting this global jewel and investing in the people who call it home.

A decade on, the community-led transformation in the Great Bear is extraordinary. In just one decade, \$81.6 million was invested in 353 projects—including 187 economic development projects and 166 conservation projects. 1033 jobs were created. 205 people were able to attend college or university. A staggering 2.1 million hectares were protected.\*

Tides Canada was effectively “born” in the Great Bear Rainforest. The collaborative approach of bringing diverse groups together for a common cause continues to define Tides Canada’s work today. We believe that positive change at a systems level starts at the local level with solutions led by the people who are closest to the challenge.

To celebrate this 10-year milestone, we began asking questions like: what impact has resulted from our work in the Great Bear? What lessons did we learn? How did these lessons guide our work as we grew to other parts of Canada, like the North? And, how is our organization’s guiding purpose still derived from this special place?

Tides Canada’s forthcoming report, *People, place, prosperity: Strategic investment in the Great Bear Rainforest* aims to answer these questions and tell this remarkable story in more detail. We look forward to sharing it with you in the coming weeks.

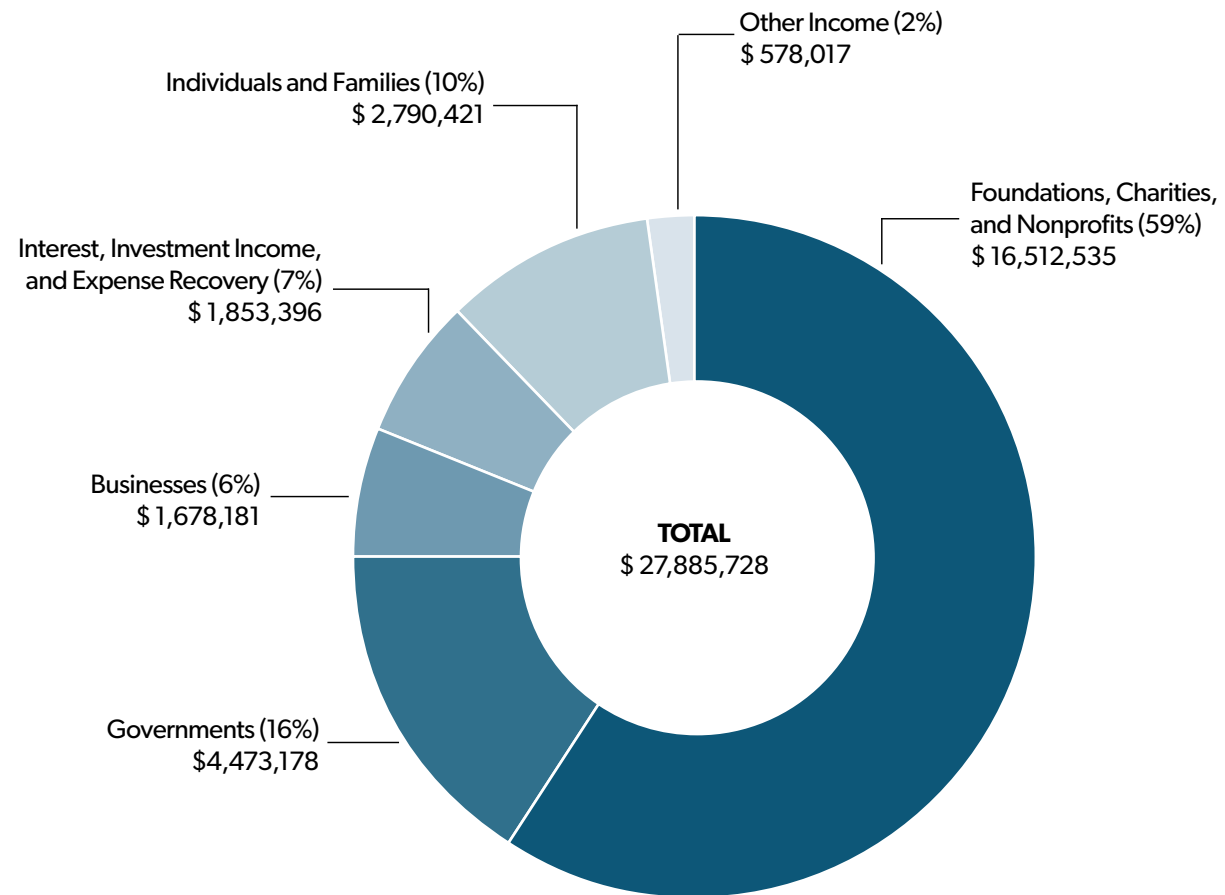

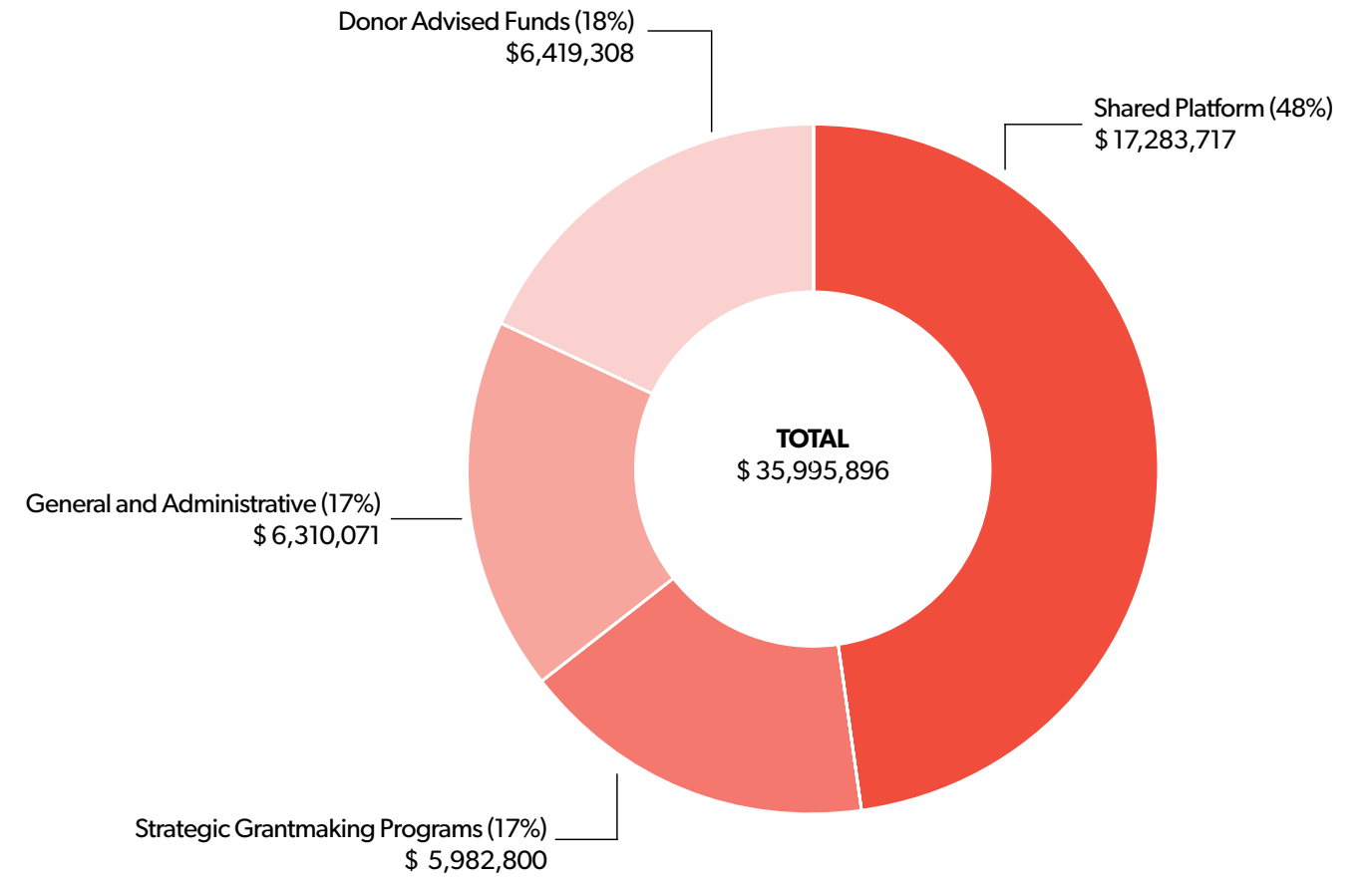

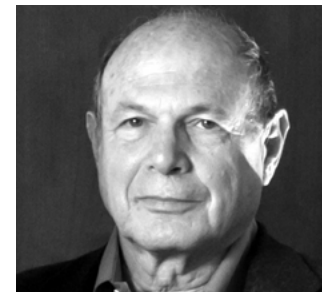
