The organization and the role

We are seeking a **Analyst and Project Coordinator** who thrives at the intersection of research and practice. The ideal candidate combines agronomic and soil health knowledge with strong analytical skills and can translate data into insights that support collaborative projects, primarily in Ontario. This person will play a key role in providing analysis, design and coordination support for innovative projects and sustainable supply chain initiatives.

Responsibilities

- Conduct background research on diverse topics such as measurement, monitoring, reporting and verification tools and frameworks, agricultural finance tools, agricultural policies and programs, and soil health practices.
- Provide project management support for the development and implementation of regenerative and sustainable agriculture initiatives scheduling meetings and organizing events, crafting agendas, taking notes, tracking project milestones and deliverables.
- Work with farmers, farm organizations, researchers, agronomists, food companies, ag
 financial institutions, non-profits, governments and other partners to seek information and
 provide analysis and insights.
- Collect, analyze, and synthesize agronomic, financial, and environmental data (e.g., measurement, reporting, and verification tools, impact indicators).
- Support the assessment and use of tools for quantifying impacts and implementing sustainable practices.
- Prepare reports, briefs, PowerPoint presentations, and case studies that communicate findings to diverse stakeholders.
- Contribute to collaborations and networks with research and evidence.
- Contribute to FoodBridge's communication (blogs, website, LinkedIn, media); support grant writing, fundraising, and administration as needed.

Essential qualifications

- Training in agronomy, agricultural economics, finance or technology, environmental sciences, or another relevant field.
- Strong research and analytical skills, including experience with (agricultural) data collection, analysis, and reporting; ability to synthesize complex information for diverse audiences and to navigate multiple digital platforms; attention to detail.





- Familiarity with agricultural realities in Ontario and ability to build relationships with farmers, agronomists and organizations; deep interest in sustainable food and agriculture.
- Strong organizational and project management skills.
- Sense of initiative; ability to work independently while contributing actively to a team; ability to respond to shifting priorities with ease.
- Excellent oral and written communication skills in English.
- Personal qualities of curiosity, perseverance, rigor and flexibility.

Desirable qualifications

- Practical knowledge of sustainable agriculture, behavioural social science and conservation practices.
- Familiarity with corporate sustainability strategies, including regenerative agriculture and Scope 3 emissions.
- Knowledge of measurement, monitoring, reporting, and verification (MMRV) tools and frameworks
- Experience working with financial institutions, ag tech or sustainable agriculture initiatives.
- Working knowledge of French.
